It is hard to imagine that the year is coming to a close so soon. As the air cools and thoughts of fall holidays and traditions settle in, there is another annual event that comes to mind. Brothers, our November meeting is an important meeting to show for. We have next year's officers to vote on as well as a possible change to our bylaws. At our September meeting our finance committee reported to the lodge a recommendation to increase the initiation fee that we charge. Currently we charge a \$100 initiation fee. We also received a report that our lodge incurs fees of approximately \$130 to \$140 per candidate that we raise through all 3 degrees. As such a motion was made to vote at our November meeting to increase the initiation fee to \$150. We plan to still offer the Brown Fund to those qualifying candidates, however the fund contribution will remain at \$50 rather than increasing with the dues increase should the lodge pass an affirmative vote for the bylaws change.

It was also brought to my attention that there could be some confusion as to the dues we will have to be paying starting with 2016. Yes, Grand Lodge did increase the dues that will be assessed at that level. This increase combined with our local lodge dues increase that we had voted on earlier in the year means that our dues paying members will be responsible for paying \$77. Please also note that annual dues are payable by January 01, 2016.

In other news, our charity committee met to review various applications for assistance and recommended our making contributions. The lodge voted and agreed with the committee recommendations. We are also pleased to see that John and Casey have both been declared proficient in the Fellow Craft and are now able to progress to the Master Mason degree. Finally, it was announced in lodge that we did receive the Grand Lodge Gold Award for our website as well as certificates for our Plus One for membership growth and our Lodge of The Year.

Finally, looking ahead to next month, along with our election of officers please don't forget that we will have a soup supper before lodge. Thank you in advance to Brother Don Giesemann for preparing this meal. As always, we look forward to your culinary delights!
