Information was read and discussion ensued regarding the thwarted attack on Milwaukee's Masonic Temple. The annual Treasurer's report was read and approved following the finance committee's audit and recommendation. Thank you Brother Ed for your meticulous records. Secretary Robertson reported 2016 starting membership for Mosaic to be 64 total; with 4 being raised and 1 death in 2016, we start 2016 with 67 members in Mosaic Lodge #125.

Brother Blinks also provided current statistics from the Schenck charity fund. To date Mosaic has awarded 46 scholarships to Dubuque's public high school's graduating seniors for a total of \$73,000 towards their college education. We've also awarded 153 applicants from local non-profit organizations over \$183,000 in funds. And 5 individuals along with some educational books have been paid out with a value of over \$4200. This makes our total giving over \$260,000 since the inception in 2004, all because of one person, the late Brother Warren Schenck. We are fortunate and grateful for his generous gift.

To end the meeting; our Tyler, Brother Mitch Kwilinski, presented his program regarding the plumb, square and level to the craft. Brother Mitch spoke about the ancient uses of these tools, how they are referenced in the Bible and how they came to be used as teaching tools in speculative masonry. For example, we are challenged to become perfect ashlars, which is a stone that has been carefully perfectly squared as judged by the square. Brother Bob Happ served pies and ice cream after the meeting. Consider joining us at our March meeting where Brothers John Wissing and Chris McQuillen will offer their program together.
