I am proud and excited to announce a fun and unique event coming to the Dubuque Masonic Temple.
The reality based game show Fireball Adventure Rally will be coming to Dubuque on Monday September 25. This show is like a giant trivial pursuit game

clues to direct them towards the various places in town that are of historical or other significant interest. At the end of the visit in each town the participants will gather in a centralized place for the public to come out and see the teams and the vehicles.

In addition to the fun to be had by the participants of the show and the general public, there is also a serious side to the adventure. While visiting each community, the participants help local charities and raise awareness for missing children. Each team is assigned a missing child to distribute information about. The team will then hand out flyers and will feature the child's information on the team car. In ten years of production there has been over 40 recoveries as a result of these efforts.

One of the sites selected to be a part of the show is the Dubuque Masonic Temple. We will have teams learning about our local history and about Masonry in general. The show's producer has requested to have as many Shriner units present as possible, both in the area where we will gather for the public showing and around our temple. Please remember that while there is no guarantee that our cars will be included in the show, the public gathering is still considered a live set. This means that filming will take place and may be included with the show. Since the show is broadcast online there is an international audience to all of this, as well. The last figure that I have been provided is that the viewing audience is approximately 4 million people for an average episode.

This is a unique opportunity for the nobility to show the world how we are able to support community events and foster positive change one neighborhood at a time.
