What is a Mason? Personal Views

(as a semi-regular feature, now, we would like to introduce this column. In it we invite our dear readers to explore their thoughts on what Masonry is and/or what Masonry means to them. To introduce this new column, we print some thoughts from Brother Dave Patton)

While Dad became a fifty-year Mason, and Mom was active in Eastern Star, they never talked about it. It was a SECRET! The only thing is, if you have a good thing going for you, the last thing you want to do is 'hide it under a bushel basket'. Instead, we need to let that light shine, and get the word out. (This is something all Masons need to work on.) Technically, I was exposed to a Masonic way of life at birth. My personal journey, however, started back in the spring of 2003, when I decided to walk away from the classroom because I was burned out. Teaching was no longer fun; instead, it became more of a job, something I HAD to do, rather than WANTING to do. In addition, the kids were becoming more difficult to deal with, and it appeared that parents weren't doing a good job of parenting - especially in

instilling core values. (It should also be noted, this was in one of the more respected buildings in the district.)
Coincidentally, about this same time, I had written an editorial for the *TH* about how we need to be 'more understanding of our youth'. To make things even more surreal, Bob Klawitter was a member of High Twelve and invited me to speak to them in May of that same year.
Afterward, he and Kenny Winninger gave me a tour of the building, then sat down with me for two hours telling me all about Masonry.

Since I had a minor in history and have a very close relationship with God, hearing about Masonry and all that it stands for really excited me. Also, how they work on making 'good men even better', and zero in on improving the lives of our young people was simply music to my ears.
