#### 2021 Grand Lodge Report – September 16-18

Iowa Grand Lodge held its 177<sup>th</sup> Annual Communication Sept 17 & 18 in Davenport. This was our first "full" Communication since 2019 as last year's, at Sioux City, was limited to 40 lodges, etc. due to COVID. Attendance was down this year too (COVID still a big topic) with only 79 or our 238 lodges represented. HOWEVER, Mosaic had 4 members present (including Bro. Sonksen - the oldest Mason present)!

The sessions were pretty routine due to small attendance, lack of any proposed legislation and no real concerns in Iowa Masonry except overcoming COVID. Our new Grand Master is **William. W. Post**, and the presumptive GM for 2022-23 (appointed Chair of the Committee on Division & Reference), is Bro. **Theodore Wiley.** 

Although most lodges have been less active the past year, quite a few gained the Plus One Award for gaining a member with Davenport #37 gaining 11! There was only one Lodge consolidation: Albion with Marshalltown. One member was expelled (from Mosaic 125, coincidentally), and the last Dispensation issued by our out-going GM was allowing Mosaic 125 to move its charter to Asbury due to "safety concerns within the building".

Note: ANY Mason in good standing may attend GL. You meet many Brothers including visiting GM's from adjacent states (I enjoyed visits with the GM's of S. Dakota & Wisconsin) We also ate too much with two major meals donated by the Iowa Scottish & York Rite bodies. (Masons DO like to eat! – ed.) As always

Other groups/businesses were there including the architectural firm doing restorative work to our GL Headquarters & Library.
