Bellevue Chapter #359 OES Stated Meeting Tuesday, August 2, 2022



Now, we no longer have a High Twelve organization in Dubuque, but Brother Dave Patton still serves on the National Board. They recently had a national convo, and therefore, we have a repot of their activities from Brother Dave. His report follows:

Although High Twelve of Dubuque #119 is no longer in existence, I am still an officer with the North Central Association of High Twelve. Being such, I am expected to attend their state and

international conventions (the last international session was in Kansas City, Kansas June 23-25).

Before, I go any further, there were a couple positives that came out of this. First, NCA was well represented with six members present. Plus, Gerald Edgar was appointed the new sergeant at arms.

The convention also normally goes off without a hitch. However, this year was an exception.

It should also be noted, for the last roughly half-dozen conventions, I have been assigned to the credentials table with another member – checking people in and awarding each person a certain number of votes, based upon how many clubs they represented, their role in their state organization, whether they were/are an international officer, etc. The problem started when several members handed in documents that had already been submitted by another representative of that same jurisdiction. So, even though I had already given credit to the first person who presented their paperwork, subsequent representatives **DEMANDED** that they be awarded the votes they were entitled to, or they weren't going to move from in front of the table! (They also pointed out that the number of votes they received did not correspond with the number that was listed in the official three-ringed binder.)

We also had individuals who presented their documents, then said they had some other ones back in their room, which they would later retrieve. (Again, more duplicates!)

So, even though we needed a paper trail, some members tried to get credit for pictures of forms on their cell phones. They then quickly made copies of that information – resulting in, even more duplication.

Others forms were illegible, or representatives didn't have the proper paperwork and then scrambled to fill out extra forms that were provided. The same with those who didn't have all the proper signatures, which they really needed! What a mess!

Since there didn't seem to be any guidelines to follow, and haven't had for

many years, following the convention, I submitted several recommendations so that future events would be able to run much more smoothly (one being that all properly filled out paperwork be submitted in a sealed manila envelope to the credentials table at the start of the first session they attended. The number of votes they were entitled to would later be recorded and passed out before the actual voting takes place.)
