There are many ideas and we hope we can put them to use to keep Masonry alive in the area.



Ye Olde Editor's Ramblings

There is a program on the History Channel, called, "The Curse of Oak Island". The Knights Templar AND Masonry are featured very heavily in the island's history. Brother Dave Patton has done some research on the Masonic/Templar connection (if, indeed, there truly is one), and he has submitted a report on his research. Part 1 follows here:

Recently, I was asked by Ms. Mary Reuter, one of the organizers for the Memorial Day Parade in Dubuque to make a presentation to members of Weight Watchers' who weren't familiar with Shriners. See, even though we regularly took part in their parades, few of them knew much about us. They, therefore, wanted to know much more. Which also meant, I needed to do some research. I should also point out, much of the information I found was on the Internet and the History Channel.

(Specifically, stories about Freemasonry, King Solomon's Temple, The Knights Templar, but more recently, The Curse of Oak Island.)

You also need to know, since many of the people in the audience were Roman Catholics, plus since the Roman Catholic Church is well-known for being opposed to Masonry, as well as, any organization affiliated with it, I had to pick and "choose" my words very carefully. So, since many of them were more acquainted with St. Jude Hospital, based in Memphis, Tennessee, I first started talking about it. (Not surprisingly, the reason they knew much more about St. Jude, is because of all the advertising being done by Marlo Thomas, and some of its young patients.)

I then mentioned Shriners started to do the same thing several years ago. (Besides, if you have a good thing going for you, the worst thing you can do, is keep it hidden under a bushel basket! Instead, you need to regularly get the word out.)

I then tried doing some compare and contrast because I believe the two hospitals are not only closely affiliated in the population they serve, but also have similar missions.

That's because St. Jude was started by

Danny Thomas in 1962 to be a childhood cancer research center. Shriners' hospitals, meanwhile, zeroed in on burns and orthopedic concerns - again of young people. (More importantly, there are no out-of-the-pocket costs.) What made it even more surreal, Danny Thomas was not only an ardent Roman Catholic, but also an active Shriner which also meant, he had to first become a Freemason! I mention that, because I discovered the Roman Catholic Church first restricted its member from joining Freemasonry, or any of its affiliated organizations somewhere back in 1738. Mainly, because the Pope at the time, Pope Clement XII, thought their beliefs and rituals were diametrically in opposition to the Catholic Church. (The question then came up was WHY?!) After doing additional research, I found out back around 1300 is when the Church really started to wield its

influence when they decided to crack down on the Knights Templar. (Again, the question came up is Why?!) [Some background information: between 1095-1291 A.D. were the years of the Crusades as European Christians unsuccessfully tried to take back control of the city of Jerusalem from the Muslims who had been occupying it. At the same time, they were fought to prevent the Muslims from taking over, and acquiring even more land. It's also important to note, the Knights Templar were wealthy, God-loving men, who were fierce fighters, while being gifted architects, clever engineers, and financial wizards. All the while, they were staunch protectors of the Roman Catholic Church, as they supplied protection for the Crusaders on their travels throughout the Middle East.] For that reason, they were highly respected around much of Europe – more importantly within the Catholic Church. Many people of royalty would, therefore, regularly hire them to guard their possessions. And, in so doing, they

Until King Philip IV (Philip the Fair) – a greedy, devious, insecure, self-centered, power-hungry, narcissistic ruler of France who would do just about anything to promote and elevate himself. (All the while, he was regularly warring against neighboring counties, which was a very costly endeavor!) Ironically, it also just so happened, King Philip was largely responsible for promoting Pope Clement V to head the Roman Catholic Church. (Largely, due to that, Pope Clement felt somewhat indebted to him.)

acquired a tremendous amount of wealth, which they often shared with others. (In recognition for their loyalty to the Church, Pope Honorius II recognized the Templars as being the 'Army of

God'.)

It should also be noted the Pope wielded much more influence and power than any king or ruler in the civilized world, therefore, it really helped to stay in his good graces. Knowing this, King Philip would repeatedly cater to his needs. To make it even more surreal, Pope Clement greatly respected and trusted the Templar – much more than even his

own cardinals and bishops – not only in protecting him, but in conducting his business affairs! (All the while, power-hungry, King Phillip would often invade other countries, which ran up a tremendously huge debt, requiring him to borrow large sums of money from others.)

About this same time, Jacques de Molay was heading up the Knights Templar. So, since King Phillip was desperate for funds, he quickly befriended him in an effort to tap into some of the Templar's wealth to cover his costs, to which de Molay agreed. (Expecting to be repaid in full!)

Once the warring ended, King Phillip was now expected to repay the staggering loan. He obviously couldn't do it since he was broke.
